

- •1/CP.16 Established MRV arrangements, including BURs and ICA
- \bullet 2/CP.17 Guidelines and modalities for the preparation of BURs and the ICA
- •20/CP.19 –Composition, modalities and procedures of the TTE under ICA
- •14/CP.19 MRV of REDD-plus information
- •21/CP.19 –General guidelines for domestic MRV


National Communications – non-Annex I countries

Frequency:

• every four (4) years;

Guidelines:

- mandated by Article 4, paragraph 1 and Article 12, paragraph 1 of the Convention
- At COP 8 (New Delhi, 2002) Parties adopted the <u>revised</u> <u>guidelines.</u> (decision 17/CP.8).


Frequency:

• every two (2) years;

either as a summary of parts of the NC in the year when the NC is submitted or as a stand-alone update report.

Guidelines:

 At COP 17 (Durban, 2011) (annex III of decision 2/CP.17)



National Communications – Non Annex I Parties

- 152 Countries submitted the 1NC : Just 2 countries yet to submit it
- 138 Countries submitted the 2NC : 20 countries (13%) yet to submit it
- 70 Countries submitted the 3 NC
- 6 Countries submitted the 4NC
- Only 1 country has submitted the 5NC and the 6NC
- Average of 10 years from 1NC-to-2NC submission
- Average of 5.6 years from 2NC-to-3NC submission, but average will increase as more countries submit






